Catch The Reading Bug This Summer at the Library

Fast bug, slow bug, red bug, blue bug. Big bug, little bug, good bug, bad bug. Catch the Reading Bug! at the Minot Public Library this summer where children can explore the world of bugs and enjoy other activities during the library's summer reading program.

Children who read a minimum of thirty minutes per week will be eligible for weekly drawings that will be held throughout the summer. Children will be given a time log to keep track of the time they spend reading each week. They will be given one chance to win for each symbol crossed off the time log. Children reading a minimum of one hour per week for two weeks will receive a pass for one round of golf at the **Jack Hoeven WEE LINKS** golf course. Children will also be given a chance to win each time they check out materials.

Drawings will be held weekly throughout the summer. Grand prizes will be given at the

end of the program. Prizes include: a Barnes and Noble Gift Card given by **THOMAS EYECARE AND EYEWEAR**; a Room, Breakfast, and Pool Party given by **HOLIDAY INN**; a Family Pass for 2009 to **ROOSEVELT ZOO**; and a Scheel's Gift Certificate given by **SIGNAL REALTY**.

Children may sign up for the summer reading program at 1:30 pm on May 29 in the Minot Municipal Auditorium Room 301. At 2:00 pm, Charlie Williams, the Noise Guy, will entertain children and adults with a special summer reading kick-off show.

The program will conclude with final prize drawings at Roosevelt Park Zoo, August 8th. Watch your local newspaper for the time and details.



Teen Summer Programs

Metamorphosis @ your Library—*Change your inside, change your outside, change your things, change your life!*

Programs are offered for ages 11 to 17. Register in advance at 852-1045 or to kmurtha@srt.com (put the name of the program in the subject line of your email).

One Book, One Summer: All teens are encouraged to read *The Absolutely True Diary of a Part-Time Indian* by Sherman Alexie. The final program of the summer, Game Night, will include a trivia contest based on the novel. If all copies are checked out, ask at the Circulation Desk to be put on the reserve list.

T-Shirt Transformation: *June 3rd, 6:30 PM in the South Meeting Room.* Turn a t-shirt into a tote bag. Bring a medium or large t-shirt (or 2 t-shirts for a sturdier bag).

My Space: *June 12th, 6:30 PM in the South Meeting Room.* Looking for ideas to flip your bedroom? Nanni Bremer of the Interior Design Centre (located in Slumberland Furniture) will help you find your design style and express yourself.

Geocaching: *June 19th, 6:30 PM meet at Oak Park Shelter #15.* Try a high tech treasure hunt with a Global Positioning System (GPS). Jim Simmons and the Minot Geocashers will teach you how to use a GPS unit and the art of hiding and finding caches. Afterwards, we'll break into teams and search for caches. This program is limited to 20 teens.

Mini-Camp: *June 24th, 25th, & 26th from 9:30 AM – 11:30 AM in the North Meeting Room.* In this two-part program English teacher Steve Grainer offers a writing workshop "From Prose to



Poetry" and Magic City Junior, Noelle Brooks, teaches you how to make amazing animated movies with Windows Movie Maker. This program is limited to ten teens.

Book Making: *July 1st, 6:30 PM in the South Meeting Room.* Make a folding scrapbook and mini notebook. Start with cardboard, card stock, paper, ribbon, and glue, and transform these pieces into scrapbooks to hold pictures, keepsakes, or autographs.

Alka-Seltzer Rockets: *July 8th, 6:30 PM in the North Meeting Room.* What happens when Alka-

Seltzer tablets are mixed with water in a confined space? Learn the concepts of flight by joining Science Teacher John Melland to create and test Alka-Seltzer rockets. Experiments will take place in the parking lot. This program is limited to 15 teens.

Murder Mystery Game: *July 17th, 6:30 PM in the South Meeting Room.* Try out your skills at being a sleuth! Become a detective or a suspect in this interactive murder mystery party game.

Game Night: *July 31, 6:30 PM in the North Meeting Room.* Wrap up the summer with a trivia contest of our **One Book, One Summer** novel, *The Absolutely True Diary of a Part-Time Indian* by Sherman Alexie. Bring your favorite board game to play. Snacks and drinks will be provided.

Grant to establish teen services at library

On February 7, 2008 the library received a \$34,000 grant from the Bremer Foundation to establish a Teen Services Program. Components of the grant include establishing programs and activities for teens and tweens ages 11 to 17, developing a teen Web page, marketing the teen program, enhancing and expanding the teen area, adding 2 computers for teen use, subscribing to electronic resources that appeal to teens, and building a core collection of PlayAway audiobooks. PlayAways are similar in size to an Ipod and come preloaded with an entire audiobook. Since teen input is crucial to the success of the program, an organizational meeting of a Teen Advisory Group (TAG) was held in March. TAG members helped develop nine summer programs, made recommendations for PlayAway title selections, and are helping develop the teen Web page. More programs are planned for the fall. Metamorphosis (Change) Teen/Tweens Summer Reading Program

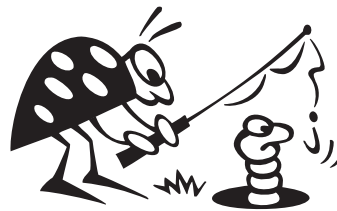
